ORDINANCE NO. 3224

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SECTION 1-109 OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS, CONCERNING THE COMPENSATION OF THE GOVERNING BODY

WHEREAS, the City of Abilene wishes to establish a policy concerning benefits provided to the Governing Body.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS:

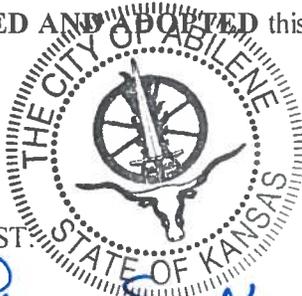
SECTION 1. That Section 1-109 of the City Code of the City of Abilene, Kansas, be established as follows:

1-109 **GOVERNING BODY COMPENSATION.** The salary of the City Commissioner serving as Mayor shall be Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per month. The salary of all other City Commissioners shall be Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) per month. The Governing Body shall not be eligible for other benefits as provided to full-time employees of the City.

SECTION 2. The Governing Body hereby rescinds any and all ordinances, resolutions, or other informal policies in conflict herewith.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall become effective and in full force from and after its passage, adoption and publication in the official City newspaper.
