

RESOLUTION NO. 091415-4

**A RESOLUTION STATING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY OF ABILENE TO PROCEED WITH DEVELOPING A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR PUBLIC FACILITIES**

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission, with the approval of Resolution No. 022414-1, appointed an ad hoc committee to review certain public facilities and make a recommendation as to the future of such public facilities;

**WHEREAS**, such recommendations were accepted by the City Commission with the adoption of Resolution No. 071414-2;

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to affirm the recommendation of the aforementioned ad hoc committee, and use such recommendations as the starting point for continued discussion of the future of public facilities for the City of Abilene; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission desires to proceed with the development of a comprehensive plan for public facilities with the intent of moving towards new facilities for police, fire, and administrative services.


**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the City Commission of the City of Abilene, as follows:

**SECTION ONE. Findings.** The governing body makes a finding that it is not in the City's best interests at this time to participate in further discussions with Dickinson County concerning the development of a Joint Justice Center that would include the Abilene Police Department and the Abilene Municipal Court.


**SECTION TWO. Comprehensive Plan.** The City Commission will proceed with the development of a comprehensive plan to address previously identified deficiencies in existing public facilities.

**SECTION THREE. Effective Date.** That the effects of this Resolution shall be in full force after its approval by the City Commission.


